


Development of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework Process and opportunities for engagement¹

At the UN Biodiversity Conference held in Egypt in 2018, Parties agreed on the process for the development of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework.²

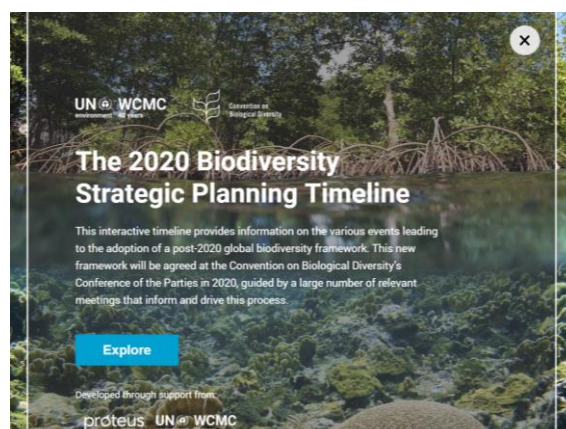
